- I. Scholarships are provided for the purposes of facilitating international education and enrolling international students with excellent academic standing at the National Chin-Yi University of Technology (the “University”), and encouraging them to pursue their studies.
- II. Recipients: The International Industrial Talent Education Special Program (INTENSE Program) or new international students (excluding students from the International Bachelor Program, Hong Kong, Macau, and Mainland China, as well as overseas Chinese students and exchange students) who are officially enrolled at the University and who have not received government scholarships.
- III. Scholarship award:
  - (1) Doctoral students studying at the University shall be exempt from tuition and miscellaneous fees for their first and second academic years. International students shall be exempt from tuition and miscellaneous fees for their first academic year, and other international pre-graduate students studying at the University shall be exempt from tuition and miscellaneous fees for their first semester. Starting with students admitted in the 2026 academic year, master's students will receive a 50% reduction of tuition and miscellaneous fees for their first semester, and bachelor's students will receive a 50% reduction of tuition and miscellaneous fees for their first academic year. Master's students admitted to the University as international pre-graduate (preparatory) students shall be charged the full amount of tuition and miscellaneous fees.
  - (2) Graduate students who have enrolled and fully registered from the second semester of the 2021 academic year (inclusive) may receive an additional NT\$5,000 scholarship per semester (up to four semesters; subject to two semesters for other international pre-graduate students).

(3) Starting from the 2024 academic year, master's students enrolled in the new specialist program (INTENSE Program) who have completed registration will be provided with a scholarship of NT\$5,000 per semester (up to a maximum of four semesters). Tuition and fees for the first year are subsidized by the National Development Council (NDC) (NT\$100,000 per academic year). Any shortfall will be covered by the university. Students must pass evaluations by both the school and enterprises for the third and fourth semesters. The NDC will subsidize tuition and fees for 70% of the students (NT\$50,000 per semester), and any shortfall will be covered by the University. The remaining 30% of students will receive subsidies according to the Guidelines for International Student Scholarships of the National Chin-Yi University of Technology.

Starting with students admitted in the 2026 academic year, tuition and miscellaneous fees for the first academic year of master's and bachelor's students enrolled in the INTENSE Program shall be subsidized by the National Development Council (NDC) in the amount of NT\$100,000 per academic year, with any shortfall to be covered by the University. Students must pass academic performance and conduct evaluations by both the University and participating enterprises for the third and fourth semesters. The NDC shall selectively subsidize tuition and miscellaneous fees for 70% of students in the amount of NT\$50,000 per semester with any shortfall to be covered by the University. The remaining 30% of students shall be charged the full amount of tuition and miscellaneous fees.

Starting with students admitted in the 2026 academic year, master's students enrolled in the INTENSE Program who have fully registered shall receive a scholarship of NT\$5,000 per student per semester up to a maximum of four semesters.

- IV. Application process: After international students have enrolled, the Office of International Affairs will make a list with the Offices of Student Affairs and submit it to the President for approval.
- V. Those who have already been awarded a scholarship under the Guidelines are not eligible to apply for other similar scholarships at the University. Applications will be withdrawn if enrollment is not completed or suspended. Students may not re-apply for a scholarship after suspending enrollment.
- VI. Funding sources: Scholarships are awarded from the University Student Financial Aid Fund.
- VII. An Evaluation Committee of International Student Scholarships and Financial Aid has been set up to review scholarship applications from international students, comprising five persons selected by the President from members of the University Student Financial Aid Committee, one of whom is elected as the convener of the Committee.
- VIII. The Guidelines enter into effect from the date of promulgation following ratification by the University Student Financial Aid Committee. The same process shall apply to any future amendments.
